Enough laws to tackle pollution, what's lacking is political will, say experts

ESHARAOY NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 31 IN 1985, social activist and lawyer M C Mehta filed a writ petition in the Supreme Court seeking the closure of Shriram Industries, which was operating in the densely populated Kirti Nagar area of Delhi and was manufacturing hazardous substances. MC Mehta vs Union of India would go on to become a landmark environmental case and, over the coming decades, the basis for a slew of orders to check air and water pollution - including the setting up of the EPA or the Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority for Delhi-NCR. With the Centre now bringing in a new ordinance for the setting up of a Commission for Air Quality Management in the National Capital Region and Adjoining Areas, a body that will see the EPA getting dissolved, Mehta says the battle against air pollution lacks not laws or committees, but political will. "If there was political will, then there are enough laws - the Environment Protection Act, 1986, and other laws, when enforced, can get the job done. The problem is of lobbies such as the vehicular lobby... If it weren't for the intervention of the courts, very little would have got done," says Mehta. Navroz Dubash, professor, Centre for Policy Research, reiterates Mehta's stance. "There should be a well-defined executive body with defined public space within it representing all sectors, because the problem of pollution is multi-sectoral. The intent of the Commission is off-kilter..." says Dubash. The Environment Ministry, however, points to fundamental differences between the EPA and the new Commission. Additional Secretary Ravi Aggarwal says, "The Commission, unlike the EPA, has the power to appoint officers and IGS of different states are also members - which is what you need for effective implementation." PRIME MINISTER Narendra Modi, on Saturday, addressed a gathering of probationary civil services officers of the Lal Bahadur Shastri Academy of Administration (LB-SNAA) in Musoorie via a video conference from the exhibition hall of the Statue of Unity as part of the second edition of Aarambh - training initiated for the probationary officers since last year.

Modi handed out an exercise to the officers, who could not visit Kevadia this year due to the on-going Covid-19 restrictions, asking them to prepare a list of items of their personal use and check for foreign brand of products. Urging them to take it as a "personal challenge", Modi asked the aspiring officers to check if they could substitute foreign brands with Made in India products to push the "Vocal for Local" campaign initiated by the government.

Modi said, "Whatever be the frame, it cannot function without sound principles. So write down your own thoughts and goals in your diary and use it when you take up your responsibilities..." Stating that he has directed elected representatives of the BJP to maintain a low profile in media, Modi said, "Media and social media will distract and lure you. But there is a difference in being in the media for good work and in doing work only to be in the media. You must follow role models who worked anonymously for the country with much discipline. RESPONDING TO two reports in The Indian Express 'Overruling own decisions, Baghel govt spares Tatas Rs 200 cr penalty' on October 29 and 'Spared by Govt, Tatas got vendor word on penalty too' on October 30, Chhattisgarh Infotech Promotion Society (CHIPS), the state's nodal agency to monitor IT projects, wrote back in two separate rejoinders stating these reports were factually incorrect, misleading and erroneous.

Implementation Committee meetings of June 7, 2019, and October 21, 2019. Representatives of USOF and BBNL agreed to the mode of payment. The SLIC agreed to the penalty amount, but left it to CHIPS to take a final call on the mode of payment. On January 9, 2020, then CEO Devasenapathi confirmed the mode of recovery as deduction of 12 per cent from each of the amount due to Tata Projects.

In both the reports, The Indian Express had sought and incorporated comments from the current CHIPS CEO Sameer Vishnoi. In the October 29 report, Vishnoi is quoted as saying the money shown as penalty was only being stopped and not deducted. "I stopped that so that we can restart the penalty procedure. Earlier, procedure was not followed," he had said.

CHIPS: There is no order passed from current CEO of CHIPS, Shri Sameer Vishnoi to set aside the penalty proposed to be levied upon the contractor. Our Correspondent: According to then CHIPS CEO KC Devasenapathi's January 9, 2020, letter to Tata Projects, "12% deduction on payable amount from every invoice raised by MSI" was decided as the mode of recovery of penalty. This penalty was deemed as "proposed penalty" by current CEO Sameer Vishnoi in his August 13, 2020, letter to the Third Party Auditor, Feedback Infra Pvt Ltd. The letter says, "With regards to withholding of 12% penalty on each of the payment... CHIPS would like to inform that final decision on imposition of penalty is pending at the appropriate authority, due to which all further payment to MSI may be proposed without withholding any amount against the proposed penalty."

The key issues raised by CHIPS and the response by our Correspondent are below: CHIPS: The line "This penalty was as per terms of the agreement between the company and the state and its imposition was a decision ratified by a Chief Secretary led committee" is misleading and erroneous. Our Correspondent: The penalty mentioned was levied and conveyed in a February 23, 2019, letter by then CHIPS CEO KC Devasenapathi to Tata Projects Ltd. It was discussed in the State Level

formal procedure of imposing a proposed penalty of 12% of the project cost on contractor M/s Tata projects Ltd. The showcase notice to Tata Projects had already been issued on August 29, 2020. Our Correspondent: Three show cause notices were sent from CHIPS to Tata Projects within the first six months till November 2018, after which the first penalty was levied on November 03, 2018. The penalty was increased to the maximum 12% of capital expenditure on February 23, 2019. Hence, the August 29, 2020, letter by current CEO CHIPS as a show-cause notice, is just repeating the whole procedure all over again. CHIPS: CHIPS has hold of Performance Bank Guarantee (PBG) of Rs 167 crore and also Additional Bank Guarantee (ABG) of Rs 165 crore. This totals Rs 332 crore which can be revoked at any point of time. This is much higher than the proposed penalty of around Rs 200 crore. Our Correspondent: It is standard practice in every contract to seek security in terms of PBG. The amounts held as PBG and the Additional Bank Guarantee are returned to MSI after the project goes live. Penalty was levied for not meeting the milestones as agreed to by Tata Projects Ltd, and CHIPS, as the nodal agency, had decided to realise it by withholding 12% from amounts payable to Tata Projects based on the invoice raised by the company.

icy which prohibits "ads promoting the brandishing of firearms". Which meant that if Sidhu had simply uploaded a photograph of herself at the range, that would have been above board, but the reason her post fell foul of the social media giant's policies was that it was an "ad". "The content in question shows firearms, which is prohib-

ited as per our advertising policies," a Facebook company spokesperson told The Indian Express. "Ads must not promote the sale or use of weapons, ammunition or explosives." Her account, however, was restored without restrictions earlier this week following discussions between her manager and representatives of the social media company. "Because they can see me with a pistol and they can see me shoot, they have blocked me from putting a caption under any new post. So I can't do any promotional work again," Sidhu told this paper just after she complained on Twitter on October 18.

"I think you can show the pistol, but you can't show firing a shot. That's probably the thing triggering the bots (that monitor posts). It gets very embarrassing because you have these paid partnerships, and now you can't put anything up," Sidhu had said. The post, which can still be viewed on her feed, was not taken down because it did not go against Facebook's Community Standards, the Facebook spokesperson said. Posting information that depicts or incites violence, compromises safety, pla-

giarism and fraud constitutes breaking Community Standards. US divide Pennsylvania with it, which hadn't voted Red since 1988.
